Any person in Ontario who grows field crops may apply for any ONE of the experiments for 1921. Each applicant should make a second choice, as the material for the first choice might be exhausted before the

application is received. The material will be forwarded in the order in which the applications are received while the supply lasts. No charge is made for the experimental material, and the produce becomes the property of the experimenter. A report is requested after harvest. Each person applying should carefully write his Name, Address and County.
