



MARLE CARE.—Light part: Whites of three eggs, one-half cup of butter, one cup of sugar, one-third cup of sweet milk, two cups of flour, one-third teaspoonful of soda, two-thirds teaspoon of cream tartar. Dark part: Yolks of three eggs, one-third cup of butter, one cup of molasses, two cups of flour, one teaspoonful of soda, spice and fruit; bake in one loaf by placing one spoonful of dark and one of light in baking tin.

At this season of the year, before you fill your cellars with potatoes, cabbages, apples, and other vegetables, you should look to the arrangements for thorough ventilation. Do not have such an arrangement that air from the cellar must pass up into the living room of your house. Such a connection between cellars and living-rooms means sickness, expense, discomfort and prohably death. Every heap of vegetables in a cellar will give off exhalations that are necessarily injurious to human health. Run no risks. Ventilate your cellars to the open air, not to your sitting or sleeping rooms. Admit to the rooms no air excepting that from outside, always avoiding the air that rises from the vegetable bins and the usual cellar medley of things perishable. perishable.
