

AWARDS AND BURSARIES

One of the central requirements of the Institute's mandate is the promotion of scholarship in matters relating to international peace and security. The principal means of carrying out this task continues to be the Barton Awards programme, designed to assist Canadians and permanent residents who wish to pursue their studies at institutions abroad or in

Canada. The programme is named in honour of William Barton, founding Chairman of CIIPS Board of Directors and a distinguished former diplomat.

There are two levels of award: up to \$14,000 for pre-doctoral studies and up to \$30,000 for post-doctoral. Individuals with relevant professional experience but not degrees at the appropriate levels may also apply. This year, the Institute made ten awards totalling \$172,000. Two scholars received \$30,000 each for post-doctoral work and eight received

\$14,000 each for pre-doctoral studies. The individuals and their fields of interest are shown in Annex G.

We also continued our modest programme of bursaries to assist with activities that do not fall within any of the Institute's other support programmes. No bursary can exceed \$500 and the application process is deliberately simple and informal. Because the available funds are limited, bursaries are rarely made available for what might be characterized as passive participation in an event such as attending a conference without a role in the programme.
