

There is only mild concern about the possibility of civil unrest inside Canada, although this is seen to be a more credible threat than an external threat to Canada's territory or airspace.

Generally speaking, Canadians with more education are less likely to characterize the threats depicted in Figure 3 as very serious and are more likely to term them somewhat serious.

Atlantic Canadians (70%) are more likely than other Canadians to see illegal fishing off Canada's coasts as a very serious threat, while Quebeckers (33%) are less likely to view illegal fishing as a very serious threat. The threat of civil unrest is no more or less important to Canadians in any province or region. Women are more concerned about drug smuggling than men - 56% of women say such smuggling poses a very serious threat, as compared to 43% of men.

C. Canada's International Reputation

Canadians appear satisfied with Canada's international reputation. Six out of seven (86%) believe that Canada enjoys either a very positive (44%) or somewhat positive (42%) reputation in the rest of the world.
