Pursuant to the Order of the Day, the Senate resumed the adjourned Debate on the motion that the Bill 101, "An Act to authorize the acquisition of lines of railway between the City of Quebec and Nairn Falls and between Lyster and St. Jean des Chaillons," be now read a second time.

After debate,

It was moved in amendment, That the word "now" be struck out of the question and that the following words be added at the end thereof: "this day six months."

The question being then put on the main motion, it was, on the same division reversed, declared in the affirmative, and

The said Bill was read a second time.

With leave of the Senate, it was

Ordered, That Rules 24a, b, and e, and 63, be suspended in respect to the said Bill.

The Senate was then adjourned during pleasure, and put into a Committee of the Whole on the said Bill.

(In the Committee.)

After some time the Senate was resumed, and

The Honourable Mr. Bolduc, from the said Committee, reported that they had gone through the said Bill, and had directed him to report the same to the Senate, without any amendment.

The said Bill was then read a third time.

The question was put whether this Bill shall pass.

It was resolved in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do go down to the House of Commons and acquaint that House that the Senate have passed this Bill, without any amendment.

With leave of the Senate,

Ordered, That when the Senate adjourn presently it do stand adjourned to to-morrow, at eleven o'clock in the forenoon.

The Senate adjourned.
