Gems. 11. That the gems, the most valued and beautiful of  
mineral substances, are not wanting in the Arctic regions,  
as is proved by the occurrence of precious garnets, beryls,  
zircons, dichroites, and rock-crystals.

General cor- 12. That the islands and lands described in this sketch  
respondence exhibit the same geognostical arrangements as occur in  
to other all other extensive tracts of country hitherto examined  
regions. by the naturalist,—a fact which strengthens the opinion  
that the *grand features* of nature in the mineral king-  
dom are every where similar, and, consequently, that  
the same general agencies must have prevailed during  
the formation of the different groups of rocks of which  
the earth is composed.
