CIRCULAR CONVENING SYNOD.

London, Ont., 24th October, 1904.

SIR,—In accordance with the provisions of Section 23 of the Constitution, we beg to notify you that, owing to the death of the Right Reverend Maurice Scollard Baldwin, Bishop of Huron, the See of Huron is now vacant.

We further notify you that a Special Session of the Synod of the Diocese will be held on Tuesday, the 29th day of November, 1904, at Bishop Cronyn Hall, London, for the purpose of electing a Bishop.

And in accordance with provisions of Section 11 of the Constitution we would call your attention to the fact that a quorum of 75 of each order is necessary before Synod can proceed to the election of a Bishop.

ORDER OF BUSINESS.

Tuesday, November 29th, 1904, Divine Service with Holy Communion, in St. Paul's Cathedral, at 10.30 a.m.

At 3 o'clock p.m. the Synod will assemble, when the rolls will be called and the necessary steps taken to proceed to the business for which the Synod is summoned.

Special attention is called to the following extracts from the Constitution :

Part of Section 3—Each Representative shall continue in office until his successor is appointed.

7. If a vacancy occur by the death, removal, or resignation of any Representative, the Clergyman shall proceed to hold a new election within one month, due notice being given by him during Divine Service, on the two Sundays next preceding the meeting, provided that no such election shall take place between the time that the See becomes vacant and the election of a Bishop, saving and except when a vacancy occurs by death, removal or resignation during the above
