## SPECIAL MEETING OF COUNCIL TAKES OVER WORK

Will Go Ahead and Complete Crew & Sons Contract - Important Meeting Re Sewage Matters.

NORTH TORONTO, Oct. 9.—(Special.)—For two long hours to-night the town council, together with T. Aird, M.P., and Engineer James, wrestled with the problem of how to take over the work of John Crow & Son at Trenton, Ont., the contractors for No. 1 sewerage district of the Town of North Toronto, and at the same time safeguard the best interests of the town.

It was one of the most intensely business meetings ever held since the business of sewerage installation for the town was ever undertaken, and monopolized every moment of the session.

The total amount of the contract entered into by Crow & Son aggregated \$287,000, and of this amount about \$100,000 in round figures, has been paid to Crow & Son, leaving some \$187,000 yet to be paid. Whether to release the letter of the contract to the town, or to let it remain in the hands of the contractors, was the question that was discussed.

Mr. Crow, at, was present, and the sympathy of the council was manifestly disposed toward him, while realizing their duty to the town. An arrangement was made whereby Mr. Crow and his bondsmen, who are sureties for the completion of the contract, would have to do the work, pay the outstanding bills, and complete the contract, and assess the loss (if any) against Mr. Crow, while the profit (if any) should be left to revert to the same firm.

Incidentally, Councillor Lawrence, in charge, for alleged negligence in signing the contract, was fined \$10,000, and the amount was to be paid by the contractors to private firms who had supplied the sewer pipes also came in for some criticism, but not rendering their accounts monthly.

Re the delay in the furnishing of the Hydro-Electric Department to the town of North Toronto, I beg to say that it was originally contemplated that a line would have to be carried from the North Toronto Station. This necessitated the completion of the line at Sudbury-street and of the C.P.R. again at Poplar Plains and Davenport-roads. We have been disappointed in our inability to get permission to make these crossings and the line has been held up as a result.

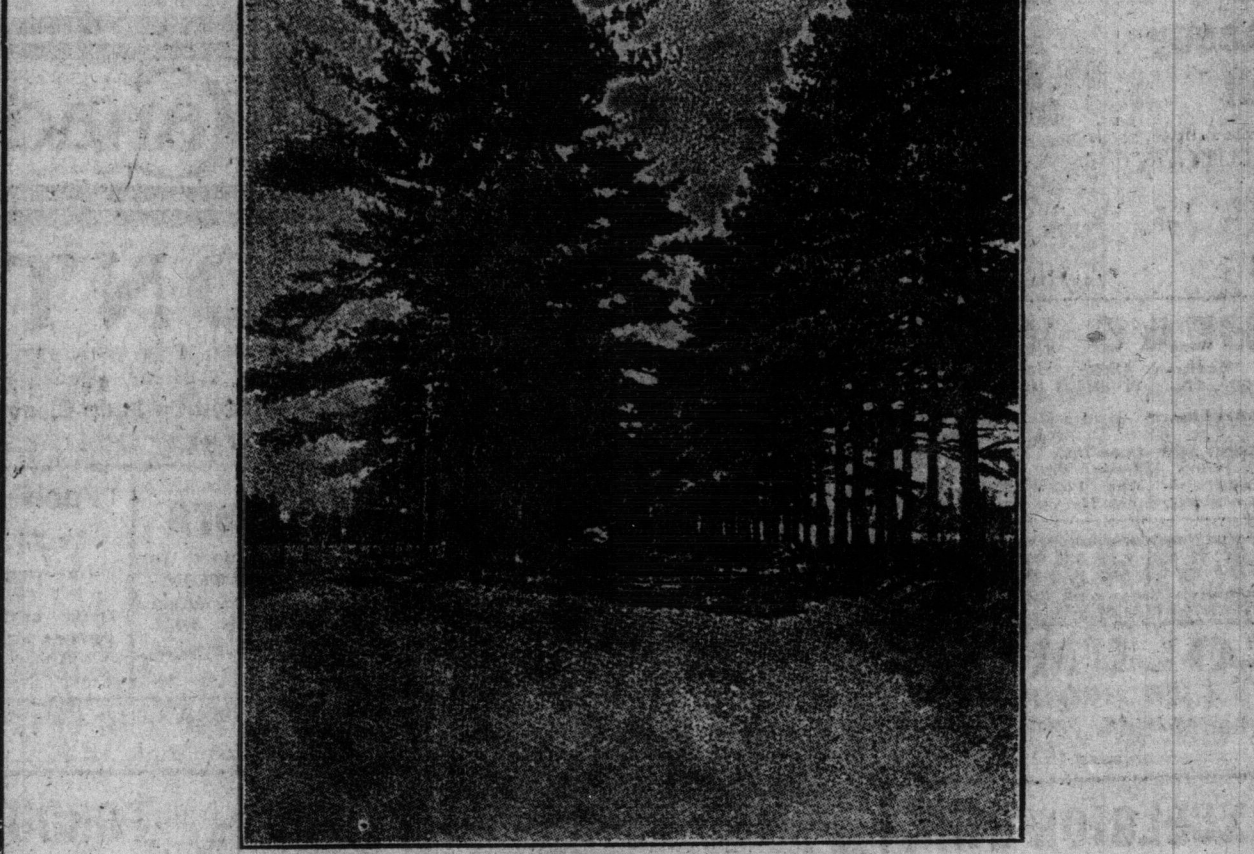
