THE MAYOR'S RECOMMENDATION

It now looks as if the citizens at large will have a chance to say whether or not the proposed settlement of the city's law suit against the Consumers' Gas Co. shall be accepted by the city. As the matter stands now the legal representatives of the two corporations have practically agreed upon terms on which the suit can be settled. In a letter to Mayor Howland, Dr. J. B. Fraser calls attention to the sad case of a young man suffering from consumption who could not be admitted to any hospital in Toronto because of the nature of his aliment. He wanted some haven provided at once.
