Cary of the Yale School of Forestry, in an interview here declared that the timber resources of the Canadian forests had been greatly overrated by the Dominion government officials and others. He has recently made an extended tour of investigation thru the Canadian forests, and says:

than forests, and says: Contrary to the boast of the Can-adians that their country was practically an inexhaustfble supply of timber, I find that the extent of the Canadian forests has been overestimated, and that the growth of timber there, even in the Northwest, is nothing like what it has been reported by Canadian authorities. Their forests are very disap-nointing, both in extent and pointing, both in excharacter of the growth.
