Berlin, April 3.—Leading ethical, philosophical and religious societies of Germany have addressed an appeal to President Wilson, giving warning against a disregard of principle to which Mr. Wilson has pledged himself, which, they claim, induced Germany to lay down her arms. The appeal declares that "if the Germans are driven to desperation, they would rather become Bolsheviks than slaves. It is maintained that the Allies provoked anarchistic conditions in Germany by refusing to relax the blockade.
