

NAVEL ORANGES ARE EXPECTED TO JUMP

Will Advance Soon, as Brokers Are Quoting Much Higher Prices.

NEW CARROTS CHEAPER

Onions Continue High Priced and Bring Four Dollars a Sack.

Navel oranges are expected to advance again, as the brokers are quoting higher prices, and those which arrived yesterday were offered at \$2.75, \$3 and \$3.25 per case.

New carrots are slightly cheaper, the bulk of those sold yesterday going at 75c per dozen bunches; a few extra choice ones bringing 80c.

Onions continue to be high-priced; another car of American, which came in yesterday, selling at \$3.75 and \$4 per 100-lb. sack.

H. Peters had a car of American onions, selling at \$3.75 and \$4 per bag; a car of cabbage at \$1.50 per box; C. Jones Bros. had a car of Upland Quail brand of oranges, selling at \$2.75 to \$3.25 per case.

CATTLE OFFERED OF MUCH BETTER QUALITY

Sold at Steady to Strong Prices at the Stock Yards Yesterday.

STOCKERS WERE LIGHT

Values Quoted Unchanged by the Leading Dealers on the Market.

Receipts of live stock at the Union Stock Yards since Saturday morning were 172 carloads, comprising 2101 cattle, 242 hogs, 186 sheep and lambs, 191 calves and 1452 horses, the bulk of the horses on route to the battlefields of France.

Butchers' Cattle.—There were 2101 cattle on the market since Saturday morning. After the milkers were deducted, there were 1890 choice cattle offered as good choice quality than last Monday, and these sold at steady to strong prices.

Amongst these were 2000 choice cattle with a week ago. Common and medium butchers' cattle were slow sale, and prices easier, and over 2000 choice cattle at the close of the market. Last Monday there were 2101 cattle sold at \$8 to \$8.25; yesterday there were three sold at \$8.25 and as many at \$8.

After the choice butchers' cattle and choice heavy steers were picked up, it was slow at the half-fat rough kind were not wanted.

Stockers and Feeders.—The supply of stock and feeding cattle was light, but seemingly quite equal to the demand, which was also light. Values were quoted unchanged by the leading dealers.

Milkers and Springers.—Trade in milkers and springers was steady. Any choice cows found in ready market. September registered Holsteins was bought by Fred Rowntree at \$112.

Veal Calves.—The market was a little easier for the common and medium classes, but good to choice veal calves were strong at steady prices, selling up to \$12 per cwt.

Sheep and Lambs.—There was a strong market for sheep and lambs at undiminished values. One carload of western sheep found in ready market. September registered Holsteins was bought by Fred Rowntree at \$112.

Hogs.—Few hogs were on sale, the bulk of those reported going straight to the packing houses. Packers were quoted on prices quoted in Saturday's World, which are 25c lower than last week. There were one lot of hogs standing in a packing house, they were equal in quality to our Ontario hogs.
