rocks, wyanotites and plintons. The question feeding was also very important. Wheat was mostly favored for feeding. G. R. Gotterell of Milton, in a discussion on the address in which the importance of keeping distinct breeds of fowls was discussed.

Prof. Hutt reported on his co-operative experiments in small fruits during the past year. The shipment of fruit in cold storage was discussed by Prof. Reynolds of the O.A.C. He had been surprised in a recent visit to the west to find that comparatively no Ontario fruit is offered for sale there, but the market was supplied with the produce of California.

FOR GOVERNMENT CONTROL. Manitoba Government Will Push Railway Policy in This Direction. Winnipeg, Dec. 6.—(Special).—With the usual accompaniment of military salutes the second session of the eleventh legislature of Manitoba was opened this afternoon by His Honor Lieutenant-Governor MacMillan.

WOMEN'S INSTITUTE. Convention of the Women's Institute was continued this afternoon in the assembly hall of the Macdonald Institute. An address was delivered by C. C. James, deputy minister of agriculture for Ontario. He contrasted the early methods of education with those of today and brought into prominence the fact that if the homes be improved all other rational improvement in farm life will come as a natural result.

ADOPT CANADIAN METHODS. (Canadian Associated Press Cable). London, Dec. 6.—Speaking at Aberdeen, Prof. James Bryce, M.P., said he had just returned from Canada and was very much impressed by the progress made in Great Britain that Canada is in a state of excitement over the proposals which have been made to adopt Canadian methods.

MAGNETIC STORMS. The interval between them has been investigated in many cases but we are now questioning the validity of the usual sun-spot period of 27.14 days.
