St. John, 16th Aug. 1854.

ORDERED. That the Committee of the Board of

Health in the Parish of Portland, be authorized

by this Board to have the Houses therein generally

fumigated: and that when houses are closed they are

therefore authorized to open the same, and that Public

Notice thereof be given to go into operation on Tues-

day next.

In consequence of the above Order, the Board of

Health hereby calls upon the inhabitants of the

Parish of Portland, to use every means in their power

to aid the Committee in carrying it out, and they re-

quest every owner of premises will see that all

Fumigating Material, and personally attend to its be-

ing used, whenever ordered by the Committee, and the Barrack Sergeant at Annapolis, the
