Is not this a sober fact, that the annual expense of one nation's navy exceeds the net profit of all the mercantile shipping owned by the civilized world?

The war debts of the European nations amount to ten thousand million dollars, (ten billions). It would require the labour of four millions of men, at one hundred and fifty dollars per annum for each man, to pay the interest of this sum at six per cent. To pay the principal, it would be necessary to levy a tax of at least ten dollars on every inhabitant of the globe!
