

MANY CHAMPIONSHIP BOUTS ARE BOOKED FOR COMING SEASON

EIGHT TITLE FIGHTS TO BE STAGED SOON

Heavy and Light Heavy
Crowns Only Ones Not
Under Fire

NEW YORK, Nov. 9.—Promise of eight championship battles, involving seven titles, was held forth to pugilistic followers today as features of an indoor boxing season which will focus much interest in the development of heavyweight challenges.

All but the light heavyweight and heavyweight crowns will be under the fire of threatening challenges, with strong possibility that new champions will be added to the long record of debentures posted during the outdoor campaign.

Leading off in the title hunt, Chick Suggs, of New Bedford, Mass., and Honeyboy Finnegan, of Boston, will clash next Monday in the first match of a three cornered struggle for the featherweight throne left vacant by the retirement of Louis (Kid) Kaplan. A bout between the winner and Benny Bass, of Philadelphia, is slated here to decide possession of the championship.

Second on the card is a junior light-weight melee between Tod Morgan and Carl Duane. The Pacific coast fighter was due here today to begin training for the match, which will put him against the New York challenger November 19 at Madison Square Garden.

ONE AT CHICAGO

The championship scene then will shift to Chicago where Mickey Walker will take his second fling at midweight honors in a tussle with the Georgia Deacon, Tiger Flowers, on December 3. Walker, who yielded his welterweight scepter to Pete Latzo last May, failed to wrest the 160 pound mantle in 1925, from the late Harry Greb.

Negotiations are in progress for another title fight later in December at Newark, N. J., where Sammy Sandell, of Chicago, newly crowned light-weight champion, and Billy Petrolle of Fargo, N. D., Madison Square Garden promoter plan three championship fights immediately afterwar.

Rosenberg defending his bantam title against Gus Graham, of Utica, N. Y., in the first. The date of the contest tentatively has been set for January 7, but Rosenberg must be restored to the good graces of the boxing officials before the match can be staged.

Other bouts would pit Fidel Lebrun against Elzy Clark of England, in an international flyweight contest, and Pete Latzo against a contender in a bout for the welterweight peak.
