"The only way to develop a power plant in this stretch of the river is to build a dam at some point across the river, backing up the water as far as property damage considerations will permit. The dam would create an artificial head concentrated at one point in place of the natural drop in the river over several miles of its length.

"There have been a few preliminary reports made in the past with reference to this site. These reports were pre-pared primarily for the purpose of obtaining franchise for a power company to develop on the river, and there is no ngineering report in existence contain-

From this survey is being made a plan of the basin showing the con-tours from the water line of the river up to an elevation slightly above very valuable properties at Woodstock that must not be flooded. Five foot contours are shown on this plan as well as all property lines. The purpose of this plan is that a dam of any height deemed feasible may be laid out there-on and the resulting flowage line plotted the whole length of the pond. From this same plan can be estimated the land and property damages and this same plan will show to what height the dam can be safely built with dis-propertionate damages to lands build proportionate damages to lands, build-ings, public works and other proper-ty. "It is also necessary to select the nost economical site for building a dam across the river, and the power house which would, as a matter of course, be adjacent thereto. 




