The increase in the use of the telephone by individual subscribers in New Brunswick and in the number of subscribers during the last year, as shown in the records of the New shown in the rec thing the telephone has become.

The records show an increase of about 1,200 subscribers in the province during 1926 and an increase of more than eight per cent. in the number of calls received at the Saint John office, distance calls each month.

The company recently commenced its distribution of the January, 1927, telephone directories, and will send out 85,000, about 12,000 being for the Saint John district, while the whole southern section will receive 16,200.


