

JACK DEMPSEY TO APPEAR IN MEXICAN RING

Lightweight Champion
Loses Decision to Jene
Johnson

MEXICO CITY, Oct. 31.—One of the largest sports crowds ever assembled in Mexico, is expected to turn out when Jack Dempsey appears at the bull ring tonight, in two exhibition matches of two rounds each, with Jack Lee and Jack League, his sparring partners. Crowds continue to trail Dempsey in the streets. Despite much sight-seeing and entertainment, the heavyweight champion has gone to the country for a brief workout daily. Among the preliminary bouts tonight will be one between Tommy White, Mexican lightweight champion, and Luis Garcia, of Los Angeles.

ELIZABETH, N. J., Oct. 31.—Jimmy Goodrich ran into a surprise here, last night, in defence of his lightweight title against Gene Johnson, of Elizabeth, the latter receiving the verdict of newspapermen at the ringside, after ten fast rounds. Goodrich, who did not appear in his best condition at 130 pounds, obtained an early lead, but was outboxed and outpunched by Johnson in the last four rounds. In the seventh Johnson floored the champion for a count of two, with a left hook. Johnson weighed 135 3/4 pounds.

PARIS, Oct. 31.—Georges Carpentier, former light heavyweight boxing champion of the world, has signed articles to meet Jimmy Delaney, St. Paul light heavyweight, in a ten-round bout in California, between January 15, and January 31, 1926.

Jack Doyle, Los Angeles promoter, announced recently, that he had mailed articles to Carpentier offering him 80 per cent. of the gate receipts and \$5,000 for expenses for a ten-round bout, with Delaney, in Los Angeles. Carpentier has said that if he wins this bout, he will seek a meeting with Paul Berlenbach, present light-heavyweight title holder, in New York.

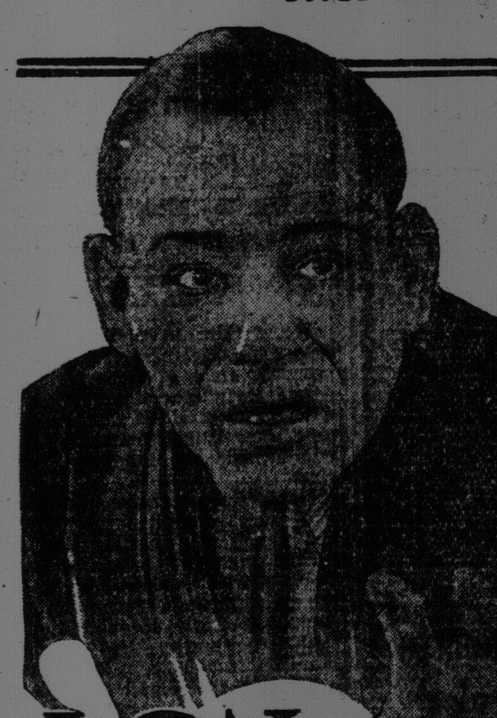
