
JCCESSFUL ST. JOHN AUTHOR. Rev. H. A. Cody has just received

a plebiscite.

German Whimpering.

London, Feb. 18—One of the notes presented by Mathias Erzberger to Marshel Foch at Treves complained of the failure of the Entente Allies to commence negotiations at Spa for a financial treaty with Germany, according to a German wireless despatch picked up here.
