nance and support of all the good and virtuous who desired the bread of life scattered broadcast in the earth, even this great National Society, with its immense publishing establishment in the city of New York, and its agents and agencies constantly and systematically employed in all the States and Territories, and even in foreign countries, has not kept pace with this Order, as its receipts will show, but has fallen short of our collections at least a million of dollars during the last twelve years, the receipts of that association being, since 1848, \$4,086,714, and ours being, as before stated, \$5,084,477.

"The Order is stronger to-day, in every respect, than ever before, with the cheering prospect of more brilliant triumphs in the future than any that have marked their past career, the increase of 1859 having been some four hundred new Divisions and fifty thousand members, male and female."
