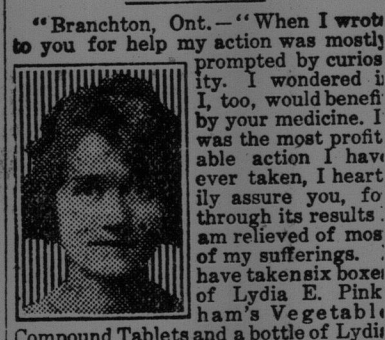

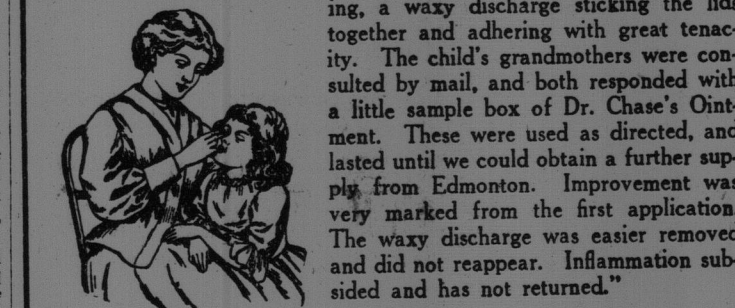

FOR CARE OF THE FEEBLE MINDED

Important Measure Introduced in House by Premier Armstrong.

Important measures affecting the care of the feeble-minded and the harmless insane in the Province of Nova Scotia were introduced in the House of Assembly yesterday by Premier Armstrong, says the Halifax Echo of Thursday's date. They have for their purpose the extending of the jurisdiction and powers of the Inspector of the Insane, or the Public Health Officers, so that he may transfer such patients from overcrowded and inadequate asylums to those institutions in other counties where facilities are better adapted for their care. It is in fact a preliminary step toward providing that larger and more modern

accommodation which the Government has been desirous of providing for some time for the segregation of the mental defective of the province. The Act to amend a chapter of the Revised Statutes of 1923 for the province introduced by Premier Armstrong provides for repeal of two sections and substitution of the following:—

"When the Inspector of Humane and Penal Institutions finds in any asylum for the harmless insane any feeble minded, imbecile or idiotic persons who are in his opinion unsuitable for treatment in such institution he shall notify the warden of the municipality or mayor of the city or town liable for the support of such person of the fact and direct that such person be removed to the Nova Scotia Hospital or to such other institution approved by the Governor-in-Council and willing to receive such person, as of him seems fit, whether in the same county or not. If after a reasonable time such removal is not made the Inspector shall cause such person to be so removed, and the cost of such removal shall be a charge upon the municipality or town liable for the support of such person, feeble minded, imbecile or idiotic person."

"Any person so removed from an asylum for the harmless insane to the

N. S. Hospital or to another asylum or institution recognized by the Governor-in-Council shall be charged to the municipality or town in which he has a settlement, and upon any other person in charge shall notify the warden or mayor of such municipality or town of the removal, and also notify the medical superintendent of the asylum or institution as to such person is chargeable."

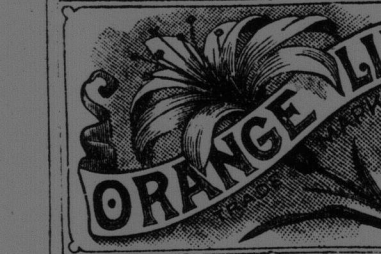

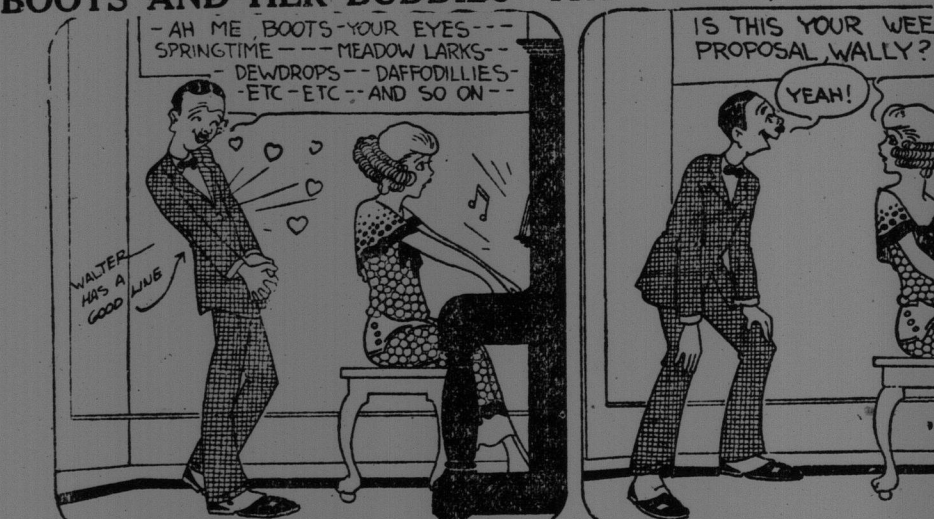

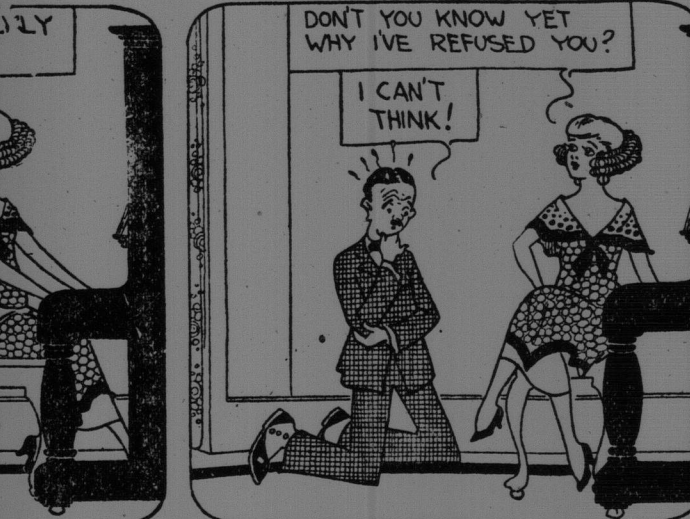
