

## MILLION ENGLISH FARMERS TO GO TO AUSTRALIA

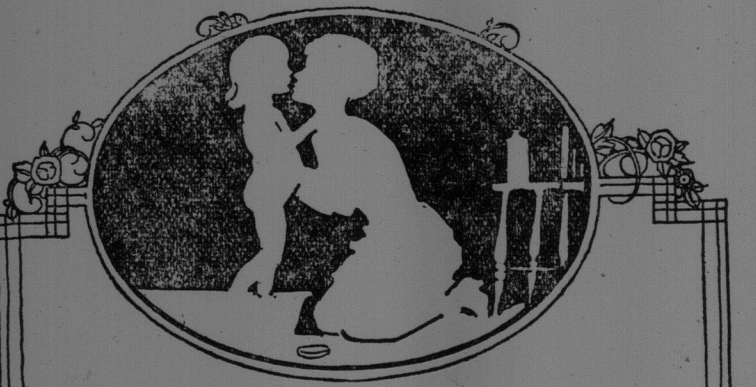
Scheme to Cost \$150,000,000, Half of Which Will be Raised by Britain.

Sydney, Sept. 21.—Australians are interested in discussing a scheme proposed by Sir Joseph Carruthers, Australian publicist and financier, for the settlement of 1,000,000 English tillers of the soil upon 1,000,000 farms in Australia, through the creation of a fund of \$150,000,000 to be raised in equal proportion by Australia and Great Britain. He argues that the scheme would permit the emigration to Australia of a large number of the unemployed service men of the kingdom to some of the richest land in the world, which as yet has never felt a plowshare. Sir Joseph stressed the value to Great Britain of the man power brought to Australia by the undertaking. He declared that it would be better for the United Kingdom to support such a scheme than to build warships in contemplation of Australia's danger, should the Pacific become a war zone.

## SECOND CYRENE VENUS FOUND IN A PERFECT STATE

Rome, Sept. 21.—What enthusiastic archaeologists describe as the most perfect Venus to light has just been discovered in the Thermal or Baths of Cyrene, where extensive excavations are being carried on under the direction of Prof. Ghislanzoni.

The statue, somewhat larger than life-size, is in a perfect state of preservation. The lovely head and arms untouched by time, and belongs to the Greek-Roman period, bearing a strong resemblance to the Venus of the Capitol. It will be remembered that another magnificent statue of Venus, unfortunately headless, was discovered a few years ago at Cyrene, and is now one of the

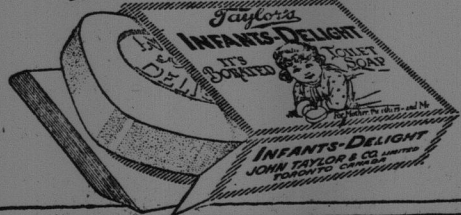

greatest treasures of the Museo delle Terme, in Rome.

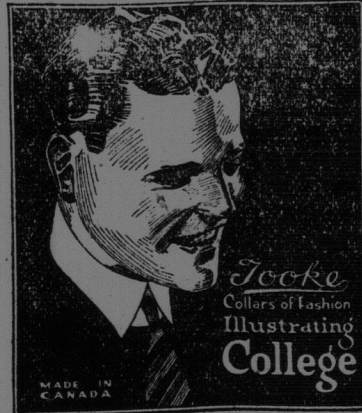
When Prof. Ghislanzoni saw the beautiful work of art emerging from the soil like Venus from the waves, he

became so excited that he shouted to the Arab workmen to put up their spades, lest they might injure the statue in the slightest detail, and with eager hands proceeded to remove the millennial earth reverently, as if unveiling a goddess. Unfortunately, he sustained some abrasions of the skin of the hands, which became infected, and for some time it was feared that he would succumb to blood poisoning.

Latest advices from Bengali, however, announce that the professor is out of danger and will shortly have the satisfaction of personally escorting the most beautiful Venus in the world to Rome.

"One thing which has struck me very forcibly while travelling through this great Canadian country is the number of large asylums which one finds scattered all over and giving the impression that there must be a great deal of mental trouble in the country," said Lady Byng at the "Ladies' Tea" given by the president and directors of the Central Canada Exhibition in Ottawa, and following a speech by Mrs. J. Charlotte Hanington on the nursing service in Canada.

"There is a great deal of mental deficiency in England," continued Lady Byng, who stated that during her three years on the Board of Guardians there it was noted that each illegitimate child passing through their hands had a mentally defective mother. Her Excellency suggested that strong steps should be taken in regard to these cases as a great deal of harm came from allowing them to roam at liberty through the country.



## GERMANY READY TO REOPEN EMBASSY

Clerical Force May Leave for Washington Within a Few Weeks.

Berlin, Sept. 21.—The German Government has given tentative orders to the clerical force which is to reopen the Embassy at Washington to be ready to sail in four weeks.

This delegation will be followed almost immediately by Counselor of the Embassy Horstmann and Secretary of the Legation Dr. Riesser. Horstmann is to have the rank, but not of Charge d'Affaires until the appointment and arrival of the Ambassador. He is the son-in-law of S. C. Wabscher, Germany's richest banker.

One reason for his appointment is that he can afford to pay out of his private monies the deficit between his salary of a thousand dollars and the cost of living in Washington.

Horstmann is a lavish entertainer, Riesser is the popular young son of a Reichstag deputy.

## WOULD PROBE CORAL GROWTH

Michigan University Professor to Make Trip to South Sea Islands—Said to Hold Age Old Secret.

Tokyo, Sept. 21.—The question as to whether a coral island begins at the bottom and grows up or starts at the top and grows down, is taking Professor William Herbert Hobbs, head of the department of geology of the University of Michigan, to a little island in the South Seas. Professor Hobbs arrived in Japan recently, and after conference with a number of prominent Japanese and foreigners, left for the Caroline Islands.

The controversy over the manner of the growth of coral islands was once settled, as was the question of the origin of man, by the distinguished scientist, Charles Darwin. Darwin's theory, unscientifically stated, is that ages ago the marine polyps which secrete the substance which forms coral began work about a mountain which rose from the sea. As the mountain

sank gradually into the sea the coral was built up, leaving a string of coral islands in the form of the atoll seen now in the South Seas. Recently Professor James T. Daley of Harvard controverted this accepted theory and contended that the coral-producing polyps began at the surface and worked down.

Professor Hobbs has come all the way from the United States in the hope of settling the question and finding the facts as to the origin of the peculiar islands. He believes, as a result of long investigation, that a little island in the Caroline group, called Ant Island, five miles south of Ponape, holds the secret.

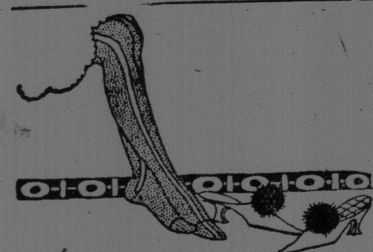
