

Women's Visiting and Aid Society.

Although our membership remains about the same, still we are glad to be able to report an increased average attendance at our meetings, which proves that the interest of the women of the congregation in our work is growing.

It will be seen by referring to the Treasurer's Report that the sum collected by the District Visitors is slightly less than last year, but not so much as to render it necessary for us to reduce the amounts given to those for whom we specially ask help.

We have had in contemplation for years past the refurnishing of the vestry, but hitherto the want of funds has hampered us. However, in the early part of the year we decided to go on with the work (making it a special and separate object, and not appropriating any of the regular contributions for it), which has been completed at a cost of \$109.84. Of this \$55.80 has been paid from the proceeds of the lecture given by Dr. Carson, of Detroit, on Dec. 4th, 1894. Our plans for the payment of the balance will be announced later on, and we bespeak the help and sympathy of the congregation in this connection.

Although our beloved pastor was not long spared to us after this improvement was effected, still we have the satisfaction of knowing that he approved of and was very much pleased with the change. We
