The prizes awarded to the pupils at the close of the academic year are kindly furnished by the undermentioned patrons of the institution.

In every class of less than twenty pupils at the time of the distribution of prizes, three names are mentioned, (one for a prize, two for accessits.)

In every class of twenty or more pupils, six names are mentioned, (two for prizes, four for accessits.)

A PRIZE OF ACCESSITS is awarded to any pupil, on two conditions:

1 º That he has not obtained any other prize ;

2 • If he is a pupil of the primary course; he must have received at least two accessits; if of the intermediate, three, if of the commercial, four.

A PRIZE OF ASSIDUTY is awarded to any pupil who has not been absent at all from the day of his arrival to the close of the year.

An Honorable Mer ion of Assiduity is given to every pupil whose absence from the date of his arrival to the end of the year does not exceed three days.

In order to reward true merit, every pupil whose application has been persevering and whose conduct has been exemplary, receives a PRIZE OF APPLICATION AND GOOD CONDUCT.
