## Diary of Events

HISTORIC DAYS IN CANADA

The Hon, Clifford Sifton, one of the conservation of a distinguished sather to attain a high place in Canadian public life, was born in Middlesex county, Ont, fifty-three years age today. His father, the Hon. John W. Sifton, became Speaker of the Manitoba Assembly, and his elder brother, Arthur Lewis Sifton, was chief justice of Northwest Territories and of Alberta before assuming the premierabil pof Alberta in 1810. Clifford Sifton, life his brother, was educated at Victoris University in Coburg, graduating in 1880 with the degree of B. A. and the Prince of Wales' medal. He was called to the Manitoba bar in 1882, and began practice in Brandon, from which place he was elected to the Manitoba Legislature and afterward to the Dominion Parliament. In the Greenway administration of 1891 he served in the Manitoba cabinet as attorney-general and minister of education, and codified the civil procedure laws of the Province. He also conducted negotiations on behalf of Manitoba with the Dominion government in reference to the Manitoba with the Dominion government after the general elections of 1896, Mr. Sifton was called to Ottawa as minister of the interior and superintendent-general of Indian affairs. In 1905 he had a disagreement with Sift Market and Saskatchewad, and resigned from the government Mr. Sifton devoted a great deal of attention to inducing the minister of the Alaska Boundary Tribunal.
