

VISITORS TO EXHIBITION SPENDING MONEY FREELY

Over Twelve Thousand Saw "Big Show" Yesterday — Everything Goes With a Swing.

The financial stringency has not yet made its presence particularly felt at the St. John exhibition for in spite of the general feeling that hard times were prevailing, the visitors at the big fair have been loosening up as freely as usual. The pickers as well as the hiders for trade in the main buildings have reported fine business at all stages, and the general impression that from a financial standpoint the show will be as good as the dominion show several years ago.

H. A. Porter, manager of the fair, said last night that he was well pleased with the attendance and the general amount of business done. He reported all the space available taken up with the exception of one small plot in the main floor, which was given up at the last moment. A large card has been secured by the manager and this will be placed on the space that should have been occupied by an industrial exhibit.

In the grounds the crowd seemed orderly and well managed. The police so far have had little trouble with anyone but they have had much work in keeping the crowds properly regulated. So far no serious accidents have been reported and pickpockets and other light fingered persons have been practically a minus quantity.

All the attractions were in full swing yesterday and the fireworks last evening attracted everyone in the grounds. About twelve thousand people passed through the turnstiles yesterday and all seemed bent on getting rid of at least part of their accumulations of wealth.

Young men from the country districts were prominent among the booths in the pike and it was also noticed that many of the city chaps were also being initiated into the mysteries of the tennis and other places of amusement. All took whatever was coming with good grace and there were few to complain that value had not been received for money expended.

The amusement hall, which has been closed during the show was opened last evening when an exhibition of physical culture was given. It is expected that the judging will be completed today. Early this morning the judges will view the Jersey and Holstein cattle and at two o'clock this afternoon the horses in the commercial, heavy harness, saddle class and the ponies will be judged.

It was also announced that the grand stand prices for the afternoon performances had been fixed at fifteen cents and that the owners of the cars blew their money for the cost of repairs.

Inside the main building near the exhibit of grains and other field products is located a little booth that has a great significance. For it is there that information as to how to properly qualify for a successful farmer may be obtained. The department of agriculture for New Brunswick has provided literature and a competent demonstrator to show, to anyone interested, the great opportunities offered to farmers in this province.

Particular attention is being given to the agricultural schools established in order to give to farmers a proper education along lines of special interest to them.

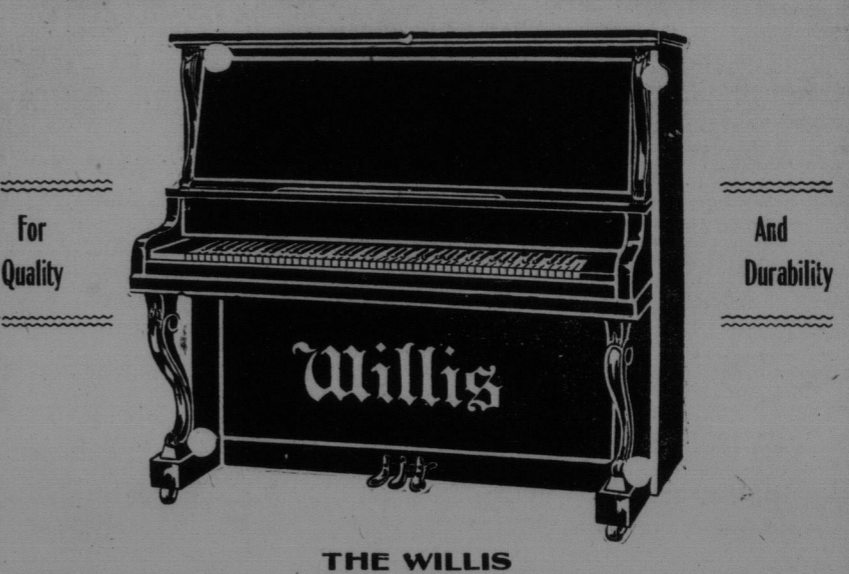
