## BRUGHESI WILL BE A CARDINAL

Recent Rome Cable Says This Was Decided After Eucharistic Congress — Prelate Notified of Fact.

Montreal, Sept. 27.—A Rome cable to the Montreal Star says: The report circulated in Canada that Archbishop Brughesi, of Montreal, is to be made a cardinal at the next Consistory, is well founded. The Pope promised him the red hat after the Eucharistic Congress in Montreal, but was compelled to delay his promotion at the last Consistory, owing to the prior claims of American candidates. As Canada and the United States are both included in the geographical denomination of North America, the Pope refrained from the simultaneous creation of four North American Cardinals, so he bestowed the honor only on Archbishops Farley, O'Connor and Falconio.

The cardinalization of Archbishop Brughesi will be announced when the date of the next Consistory is fixed. The Prelate has already been notified of his promotion, but is bound to secrecy.

### How Story Leaked Out.

A member of the Redemptorist Order recently applied to the General of Redemptorists here and asked permission to come to Rome, his motive being that he wished to accompany the Archbishop, who was shortly to be created a Cardinal. Thus the story leaked out.

Officially the Vatican are now non-committal on the subject. The next Consistory will probably be held some time in November. The date has not been fixed, owing to the church crisis in Portugal. The Pope, at the last Consistory, withheld the name of a new Cardinal created then, but who, it is known was the patriarch of Lisbon. His name must now be announced.

### SOME FACTS ABOUT THE BIBLE SOCIETY

Tomorrow will be Bible Sunday, and in various city churches the pastors will deliver special sermons in honor of the occasion, and will also read the claims of the Bible Society to public support. A pamphlet published by the society gives the following facts and figures in regard to its work and purpose:

1.—In its 108 years of service the British and Foreign Bible Society has circulated over 235,000,000 copies of the Scriptures or portions thereof.

2.—Last year its circulation was 7,352,202 copies.

3.—It has issued the Bible in 440 languages.

4.—It has put the Word into 33 tongues in the raised type for the blind.

5.—Last year 8 new translations were made.

6.—Revisions are being constantly made of Holy expense.

7.—Owing to the unprecedented demand for the Scriptures last year, there was a deficit on the year's operations of the B. and F. B. S. of over \$30,000.

8.—One hundred and ten languages are spoken in Canada.

9.—Taking one year with another the Canadian Bible Society does work in all the 110 tongues of the Dominion, and last year it rendered service in over 50 languages, placing in circulation more than 210,000 copies of the Word.

10.—Immigrants are coming into the Dominion at the rate of one for every minute of our waking hours throughout the year.

Want Eight Hour Day.

There was a large attendance at the mass meeting of the carpenters, joiners and wood-workers, held in the Opera House last evening to discuss the question of moving for an eight hour day and other improvements in the condition of the trades. General Organizer was the principal speaker, telling what organization had effected in other parts, and urging the workers to use their political power to better their condition. The meeting was enthusiastic and it was decided to begin a campaign at once for the purpose of securing an eight hour day next spring.
