

STRENUOUS PRESIDENTIAL CAMPAIGN IN UNITED STATES ENDS AT LAST

Millions of Electors Will Go to Polls Tomorrow — Does Germany Want Hyphens in Republic to Support Wilson? Roosevelt's Old Party Still Divided—Many Questions, Including Suffrage and Liquor Issue, to Be Voted on in Several States—Result of Vote for President in Doubt

Boston, Nov. 5.—Will it be Wilson or Hughes? This is the question which is being discussed throughout this and many other countries. The animated campaign of several months closed practically everywhere on Saturday night, although those on the mailing circuit, both the Democratic and Republican leaders claim to be confident of the election of their candidates for the presidency.

What the large hyphen vote in the country will do has been a subject of discussion not only in the United States but in Canada, Mexico and European countries. As a matter of fact the German and Austrian vote will not be concentrated upon any one candidate. It should be remembered that many Germans in New York, Boston, Cincinnati, Milwaukee, St. Louis, Philadelphia and other large centres are Socialists. For instance, Eugene V. Debs received nearly 900,000 votes in the country, 33,481 of which he obtained in Wisconsin, where a Socialist congressman, a German, was elected.

Many Independent Germans. The Socialists of German extraction have little use for the Kaiser or Prussian militarism and many of them left the old country because of Hohenzollern tyranny, although naturally they have a friendly feeling for the fatherland itself. They are opposed to monarchy. Many Independent Germans will vote for Wilson because they fear Hughes might be a worse man from a German standpoint. Wilson they know, but Hughes they don't know. A certain percentage of the hyphen element will support Hughes in Tuesday's election. A significant feature of the campaign is the publication of a communication from Karl von Wiegand, the well known Berlin correspondent, who says that Germany would be better pleased with the election of Wilson. The communication is interpreted as an appeal from Germany to her sons in America to vote for the president.

Independent newspapers in the United States and with a very large Wall Street and financial clientele, has declared directly as in favor of the election of President Wilson on the ground that Judge Hughes has been measured in the balance during his campaign tours and has been found wanting. Fifty prominent magazine writers and authors of the country have signed an appeal in favor of Wilson.

Many manufacturers and bankers, Mr. Roosevelt and some of the Bull Moose leaders have strongly urged the election of Hughes, but John M. Parker, Progressive candidate for Governor, has been campaigning for Wilson. It is apparent therefore, that quite a percentage of former Republican voters have been campaigning for Wilson. The Wilson leaders expect him to run away ahead of the Democratic ticket in most of the states, including Maine and this state.

Early Returns in Massachusetts. The polls in this state will open at six o'clock Tuesday morning and in most of the towns will close at 4 p. m. The Boston polls close at that hour. The first returns in the United States will probably be reported by a number of Cape Cod and Plymouth county towns in this state. In a dozen of these towns the polls usually close about 2 p. m., when all the available vote is usually found to have been deposited. The returns from these places will be available for the afternoon regular editions of the newspapers throughout the country.

United States you will vote the Republican ticket next Tuesday." What States Will Vote On. South Dakota will vote on woman suffrage. A proposal for a State bonding commission will be voted on in Montana. The various States will elect 34 governors and 633 United States senators. Massachusetts will decide as to whether New Year's day shall be a legal holiday. In Connecticut, Rhode Island, Arizona, Colorado and Kansas there are women candidates for secretary of state. Of the forty-six women seeking State offices, the majority (twenty-four) are nominees of the Socialist party. Nebraska, Missouri, Michigan, California, Montana and South Dakota will vote on the question of Statewide prohibition. Colorado will vote on a proposed amendment to the prohibition law which would permit the sale of Colorado-made beer in the State. Arkansas will vote on a proposal to repeal the Statewide prohibition law and substitute in its place a local option measure. In Minnesota the initiative and referendum amendment to the constitution will be submitted to the voters for the third time. Alabama will vote on a constitutional amendment making a provision whereby each county may have the right to levy a special 3-mill school tax. Oregon will vote on a proposal to permit the manufacture of 4 per cent. malt in the State, which is now under strict prohibition. Idaho is the only State where a woman is candidate for governor, Annie B. Triploh being the Socialist nominee for chief executive there. In Montana Jeannette Rankin is the regular Republican nominee for Congress and in Colorado Hattie K. Howard is running on a Progressive ticket.

New York will vote on the issuance of \$10,000,000 State bonds—\$2,500,000 for the Inter-State Park and the rest for the extension of the State's forest preserves. The voters of Mississippi will be given an opportunity to ratify or reject the "quart-a-time" and anti-advertising liquor laws, framed and passed at the last session of the legislature. The men and women of Arizona will vote anew on the prohibition question.
