MORE ST. JOHN MEN FIGURE IN THE LIST OF CASUALTIES

Sergt. Major Fraser Killed in Action—South African Veteran Dies of His Wounds—Other Soldiers Wounded.

Dr. James Manning received a cable yesterday from Hon. J. D. Hazen, who is at present in London, informing him that his son, Lieut. Harold Manning, is not seriously wounded. This news will come as a great relief to his parents and many friends.

That Sergt. Major Donald Drummond Fraser had been killed in action on April 12th was the sad intelligence received by his parents, Mr. and Mrs. A. W. Fraser, of Duke street, West St. John, yesterday.

Sergt. Major Fraser was twenty-one years of age, having enlisted when he was but eighteen. Previous to enlisting he had been a clerk in the Royal Bank of Canada in this city, and he had many friends throughout the city who will learn of his death with deep regret. In their double bereavement the parents will have the sympathy of the entire community.

Both boys enlisted in the same unit, a mounted infantry regiment and went overseas together. On the other side they were drafted to different infantry battalions. On the day that Donald was entering the trenches for the first time, he met his brother who had been wounded and who was being carried out on a stretcher, and they stopped and chatted for a few minutes. In due time the parents received word that Pte. Murray Fraser, had been reported wounded and missing, and that was the last word they were able to secure, despite diligent inquiries. Finally came the announcement that, in absence of other information, he was officially declared dead.

Pte. J. A. Jesso.

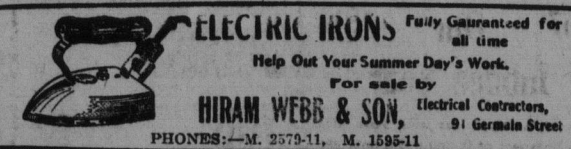
