PRINCE HAS CLEAR CARRYING VOICE

ALL WHO HAVE HEARD HIM REMARK HIS SPEAKING ABILITY. Everyone who has heard him has commented upon the Prince of Wales' remarkable voice. It is clear with great carrying powers, the enumeration is distinct. Every word is well defined. Very few public men possess a voice of such splendid speaking quality. Without apparent effort he can make himself heard four and five hundred yards away. The Prince's critics of voice qualities are the holders who have listened to his speeches and speeches expressed through the medium of all sorts of organs from the voices of sergents to the voices of princes of the blood on days of high ceremony, praise with emphasis the speaking ability of the Prince of Wales. And further the Prince has a happy aptitude for choosing words of concise direct and attractive meaning. What phrase could be better than his "The Victory Loan is the bridge between war and peace." The Prince of Wales has consented to the use of his coat of arms on a flag which is to be the prize of honor for districts winning their quota in the loan. A flag will also be given to organizations of fifty or more members. "I hope every city and district will win my flag," says the Prince. The Alice M. Moulton is a British vessel of 196 tons, and sailed from Lisbon, July 29, for Newfoundland. The General Knox is an American ship of 1,587 tons, built in 1918. The Toronto was on her way from Antwerp to New York.

CANDIDATE IN NORTH ONTARIO DIED SUDDENLY

CANNINGTON, Oct. 21.—Mr. W. J. Cowan, Unionist candidate in the by-election in North Ontario riding for the Commons, died suddenly here this evening of apoplexy.

Mr. Cowan was apparently in good health at the official nomination yesterday afternoon. The voting takes place on Monday next. The candidate nominated against Mr. Cowan yesterday was Mr. R.H. Halbert, resident of the U.F.O. No "Acclamation."

OTTAWA, Oct. 21.—The sudden death of Mr. James Cowan, the Unionist candidate in the North Ontario by-election, subsequent to his nomination, does not mean that Mr. Halbert, the U.F.O. candidate will be elected by acclamation on Monday next. Provision is made in the Dominion Election Act for such a contingency, the returning officer under such circumstances being authorized to postpone the date for polling so that a new candidate may be nominated.
