A Petition of Elijah Phinney, and others, was prefented by. Mr. Ritchie, and read, praying an aid for improving the road leading from the Post Road to the Bay of Funday, in the upper diffrict of Wilmot.

A Petition of Benjamin Dodge, and others, was prefented by Mr. Shaw, and read, praying an aid for making a road from Chute's Cove, on the Bay of Funday, over the North Mountain, to the main road in Granville.

A Petition of Nathaniel Parker, was prefented by Mr. Collins, and read, praying the fum of 261. 125. 8d. the amount of expenses incurred by him in exploring the beit place for a public road to Liverpool from Nichaur fettlement.

Ordered, That the petitions do lie on the table.

Mr. Pyke moved, that the committee be directed to hold a further conference with a committee of the Council on the fubject of the conference held on Saturday; and to state that the House is defirous to obtain a more convenient place to fit in during the present Seffions, and to request a Committee of His Majesty's Council to join a Committee of this House to alcertain if a more convenient place can be procured for that purpose; which being seconded and put, and the House dividing thereon; there appeared for the motion, 12-against it, 7. So it passed in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do requeit a conference with the Council, agreeably to the foregoing refolution.

On motion of Mr. Haliburton, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the confideration of His Excellency's Speech.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Pyke took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker refumed the Chair.

The chairman reported from the committee, that they had made fome progress in the business to them referred, and that the Committee had directed him to move for leave to fit again on the confideration of the fame, which report the Houle agreed to
