

A Petition of Elijah Phinney, and others, was presented by Mr. Ritchie, and read, praying an aid for improving the road leading from the Post Road to the Bay of Funday, in the upper district of Wilmot.

A Petition of Benjamin Dodge, and others, was presented by Mr. Shaw, and read, praying an aid for making a road from Chute's Cove, on the Bay of Funday, over the North Mountain, to the main road in Granville.

A Petition of Nathaniel Parker, was presented by Mr. Collins, and read, praying the sum of 26l. 12s. 8d. the amount of expenses incurred by him in exploring the best place for a public road to Liverpool from Nictaur settlement.

Ordered, That the petitions do lie on the table.

Mr. Pyke moved, that the committee be directed to hold a further conference with a committee of the Council on the subject of the conference held on Saturday, and to state that the House is desirous to obtain a more convenient place to sit in during the present Sessions, and to request a Committee of His Majesty's Council to join a Committee of this House to ascertain if a more convenient place can be procured for that purpose; which being seconded and put, and the House dividing thereon, there appeared for the motion, 12—against it, 7. So it passed in the affirmative.

Ordered, That the Clerk do request a conference with the Council, agreeably to the foregoing resolution.

On motion of Mr. Haliburton, the House resolved itself into a Committee of the whole House, on the consideration of His Excellency's speech.

Mr. Speaker left the Chair,

Mr. Pyke took the Chair,

Mr. Speaker resumed the Chair.

The chairman reported from the committee, that they had made some progress in the business to them referred, and that the Committee had directed him to move for leave to sit again on the consideration of the same, which report the House agreed to.

Then the House adjourned until To-morrow at Eleven of the Clock.

A Petition of Elijah Crane was presented by Mr. Crane, and read, praying a remuneration of expenses incurred by him as a Commissioner of Roads.

A Petition of Thomas Parker and others, was presented by Mr. Archibald, and read, praying an aid to open a road from the Meeting House, near to John Ellis's, to the road leading from Halifax to Truro, and also a road to the bridge at Gourley's.
