CHAP. VII.

An ORDINANCE

To prevent the felling of strong liquors to the Indians in the province of Quebec, as also to deter persons from buying their arms or cloathing, and for other purposes relative to the trade and intercourse with the said Indians.

REAMBLE.

No ftrong liquors to be fold or diftributed to Indiass. HEREAS many mifchiefs may be occalioned by the practice of felling rum and other ftrong liquers to the Indians, and of buying their cloaths and arms, and alfo by trading with the faid Indians, or fettling amongst them, without a licence, It is ordained and enacted by his

excellency the captain general and governor in chief of this province, by and with the advice and confent of the legiflative council of the fame, THAT

ART. I.

From and after the publication of this ordinance, no perfon or perfons whatfoever shall fell, distribute, or otherwife dispose of, to any Indian or Indians within this province, or to any other perfon or perfons for their use, any rum or other strong liquors, of what kind or quality foever, or shall knowingly or willingly suffer the same, in any manner, to come to the hands of any Indian or Indians, without a special licence in writing, for that purpose first had and obtained, from the governor, lieutenant governor, or commander in chief of this province for the time being, or from his majesty's agents or superintendants
