

## MUNICIPAL CORPORATION—

To appoint a Clerk, who shall hold office at their pleasure, and be paid salary out of tax on the whole rateable property.—sec. 169, p. 92.

Created under this Act to be in the place and stead of former Corporations, and to have all their powers, liabilities, and obligations as to suits previously commenced, &c.—sec. 175, p. 94.

Duty of to assume and provide for payment of debts due by localities over which preside.—sec. 176, p. 94.

Duty of to levy sufficient money to pay all debts, and as to loans.—sec. 177, p. 95.

Members of seeking to evade payment of a loan created by any By-Law, guilty of a misdemeanor.—sec. 178, p. 96.

To submit to Governor General annual account of debts and means of liquidation.—sec. 180, p. 98.

On petition of one-third of the members, Governor may appoint Commissioners of Inquiry into the financial and monetary affairs, &c. of Corporation.—sec. 181, p. 98.

Making or uttering Bonds contrary to this Act, a misdemeanor.—sec. 184, p. 101.

Officers and members of may be witnesses and Jurors in cases where the Corporation is concerned as a party.—sec. 186, p. 102.

Cannot lawfully stop up any original allowance for Roads.—sec. 187, p. 102.
