tion will be greater or less as the pepper comes from a sandy soil or otherwise, so that this estimation cannot be expected to be so uniform in its indications for genuine berries; although it should be easy to fix a limit which should never be exceeded by the sand: *i. e.* residue insoluble in hydrochloric acid. The following maxima have been suggested or adopted by the authorities quoted :--
