Sir I have the honour to state to you for the information of Major Gen^l Widdington, that on the 7th Inst, I was furnished by the Commissariat at this Post with blank Receipts, drawn after the usual form, in which I had been accustomed to receive my Pay, with this difference, that these expressed the sum to be "for my gratuity" from the 25th June to the 24th December 1817.

Taking it for granted that I should by the succeeding Post be officially notified, either in General Orders, or from the Head of the Department in this Province, of the period when my appointment ceased, I drew upon Dep^y Asst Commissary General Fleming at Montreal, for the above mentioned gratuity, as I was verbally instructed to do at the Commissariat Office here.

No official communication has yet been made to me that my appointment has ceased; I would therefore beg leave to request that you will be pleased to submit to the consideration of Major Gen^l Widdington, whether I am still to consider myself under his orders, and to what period I may be authorised to draw my allowances.
