Hingston 26 Hugust 1814 To ballain Pepon And De Camp In Thave the honour to State to your for the information of Major Gint Weddington, that on the youth I was furnished ligthe Commissarial at this Post with blank recipits, drawn after the usual form, in which I had been accustomed to recive my Pay, with this difference, that these expressed the sum to be for my gratuity from he 25 June to the 24 December 1814" Taking it for granted that I should by the Successing Post be Oficially motified, either in General Orders, or from the Head of the Department this Occovenes, of the period when very appoint ment ceases, I drew upon Dept ap Commisse General Henring at Montreal, for the above monthing gratuity, as I was verbally instructed to do at the Commissarial office here. No Official communication has get been mude to me that my afford must have ceased. I would therefore by live to request that you with to pleased to submit to the consideration of Major Gent Misdrington, whether I am still to consider myself under his orders, and to what period I may be authorised to draw my allowances.
