Flying time 516.25 hours. Night flying washed in at 2100 hours. Edenvale: Flying washed in 0800 hours, washed out 1800 hours. Flying time 117.25 hours. F/O R. Watterman from A.F.H.Q. visited the Unit to spend a few days looking over the Synthetic Armament set-up. At 0050 hours Harvard II 3129 groundlooped after landing on Main Aerodrome. Neither the Instructor, F/O R. Parkinson J28168, or the student, GB1045936 LAC Stalker. P.C. were injured. Categorized D-2.
