I wish your local committee would arrange to write him. As to Sir Allan Aylesworth, some of our friends here think it would be better for me to commence the campaign myself, and that in the long run we will make better headway by not bringing anyone in from outside. Please consider this point with other friends in Stouffville.

I shall reach Stouffville some time during Thursday afternoon, and if the committee has anyone ready to take me around I shall give the time, up to the time of the meeting, to canvassing, and any time that may be necessary on the following morning. I go on to Mount Albert the next night. Perhaps the committee will have a meeting in the interval, and arrange who are the persons I should see.
