I am following this matter and will report any important programmes of which information comes available.

I am a little disappointed in the lack of response to your letter to Major Murray of January 7th, copy attached. I think the C.B.C. is a little slow. I have spoken to Major Murray and shall continue to press the matter until a satisfactory routine is established. It has, of course, been a heavy week for all concerned.
