Following the passage of the Fordney-McCumber teriff in the United States, Mr. Fielding, in his Budget speech of Mny 11, 1983, declared:

"I am proposing that we shall put into our tariff laws today a declaration of our readiness and our willingness to make an arrangement with the United States whenever they are ready to meet us on fair terms. I propose to put in this clause:

'The Governor in Council may authorize any Minister of the Crown to enter into negotiations with any authorized representative of the government of the United States with a view to the making of a commercial agreement between the two countries on terms that may be decad mutually beneficial. Any agreement so made shall be subject to the approval of the Parliament of Canada.*

"This is a general indication of our willingness to make a commercial treaty with our neighbours. We
