



Sir:-

With reference to your report for the months of May and June, and the Department's letter to you of the 18th ultimo, in regard to the unanimous desire of the Indians of the West Coast and Kwawkewith Agencies to be allowed the exclusive privilege to fish in or about the mouths of streams flowing through Indian Reserves in the vicinity of Alert Bay, etc. I beg to say that the Deputy Minister of the Naval Service, to whose attention the matter was brought, has stated that it would be given careful consideration.
