By direction of the Commanding Officer, all evidence is taken on Oath.

FIRST WITNESS
For the
Prosecution

Lieut B.V. Lavery, an Officer of the Canadian Army, Overseas, on strength of "B" Wing, No. 4 Canadian Repatriation Depot, having been duly sworn states:

" I am Lieut B.V. Lavery, Assist Adjt of "B" Wing, No 4 Canadian Repatriation Depot. I produce herewith certified true extract of No 4 Canadian Repatriation Depot Part II Daily Order No 85, dated 13 NOV 45; showing an entry stating that B-86852 Pte LEVACK, R. is AWL wef 2359 hrs, 4 NOV 45. I further state that the cost of returning B-86852 Pte LEVACK, R. to this Unit was 10 shillings and one pence (10/1), this being the cost of railway fare for escorts from London to Northampton return".

" I also produce A.F.O. 1617 showing B-86852 Pte LEVACK, R. surrendered to Police Constable 40 LONDON at NORTHAMPTON at 1915 hours, 21st November, 1945, in Uniform."

The accused declines to cross-examine the witness.
