## RULE IX.

Members may be allowed the perusal of Books, either of Circulation or Reference, in the Reading Room, and the same, when delivered to the party, shall be entered by the Superintendent in a Book to be kept for that purpose; but any Member taking any Book obtained in such manner out of the Institute, shall incur a fine of two shillings and sixpence, and shall not be allowed the privileges of the Library until the same be paid.

## RULE X.

If any Member lose or injure a Book belonging to the Library, he shall pay the value of, or replace the same; and if the Book belong to a set, he shall pay the value of, or replace the set.

## RULE XI.

Any Member lending a Book to any other person shall be fined two shillings and sixpence.

## RULE XII.

The Superintendent shall be bound to see that the Rules of the Library are observed, endeavor to obtain all Books kept beyond the proper time, collect all fines, keep the Books in their proper place in the Library; and shall report, from time to time, to the Library Committee, the names of any works kept beyond the proper time, or which may be lost, together with the names of the Members who may keep or shall have lost them.
