UNION.

A post village in the Township of Yarmouth on the stage road from St. Thomas to Port Stanley. Distant from St. Thomas 5 miles; 3 miles from Port Stanley, and 6 miles from Sparta.

The large woollen mills of Haight & Willson, were established in 1866. The buildings are frame, 125 x 36 feet; 3 storeys high; water power is used and 10 hands employed in the manufacture of all fabrics in their line and custom work.

Green's Woollen Factory is carried on by George Doughty. It is the oldest factory of the kind in this section of the County. The buildings are frame, 160 x 40 feet; 2 storeys high; 10 hands are employed in manufacturing and custom work.
