HOMESTEAD REGULATIONS.

Any even numbered section of Dominion Lends in Manitolas or the North-west Territorics, excepting 8 and 50, which has not been homestended, or reserved to provide wood hots for settlers, or for other purposes, may be homestended upon by any person who are sole head of a family, or some quarks word 13 years of age, to the other some quarker see thon of 130 secon, more or less.

ENTRY.

Entry may be made personally at the loca land office for the District in which the land to be taken in situate, or if the homestealer desires he may, on application to the Minister of the Interior, Ottawa, the Comma Agent for Immigration, Winnipeg, and is situate, receive autority is some one to make entry for him. A fee of \$10 is charged for a homestead entry

HOMESTEAD DUTIES.

A settler who has been granted an entry for a homestead is required by the provisions of the Dominion Lands Act and the amendments thereto to perform the conditions connected herewith, under one of the following plans: -

At least six months' residence upon and ultivation of the land in each year during the erm of three years.

(2) If the father for mother, if the father is deviated) or any perion who is eligible to make homestead entry upon the provisions of this Act, resides upon a farm in the vicinity of the land entered for by such person as a home-stead, the requirements of this Act as to re-sidence prior to obtaining patent may be satisfied by such person residing with the father or mother.

(3) If a sottler has obtained a patent for his homestead, or a certificate for him lease of auch patent his Act, and has obtained entry for a second homestead, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the terms be assisted by residence upon the terms be assisted by residence upon the terms be assisted by residence upon the terms by the first homestead.

(4) If the settler has his permanent residence upon farming land owned by him in the vicinity of his household, the requirements of this Act as to residence may be satisfied by residence upon the said land.

The term "vicinity" used above is meant to indicate the same township or an adjoining or cornering township.

A settler who avails himself of the provisions of Clauses (2) (3) or (4) must cultivate 30 acress of his homestead, or substitute 20 head of stock with buildings for their accommodation, and have besides 80 acress substantially fenced.

Every homesteader who fails to comply with the requirements of the homesteader law is liable to have his entry cancelled, and the land may be again thrown open for entry.

APPLICATION FOR PATENT

Should be made at the end of the three years before the Local Agent, Sub-Agent or the Homostead Inspin settler must give as months notice in writing to the Commissioner of Dominion Lands at Ottawa of his intention to do so.
