THE AGRICULTURAL NEWS
The Canadian Dairyman and Farming World is the official organ of the Canadian Ayrshire Breeders' Association. All of whose members are readers of the paper. Members of the Association are invited to send items of interest to Ayrshire breeders for publication in this column.

Ayrshire breeders in the United States are making some good records of milk and butter. Ten to twelve thousand pounds of milk with from five to six hundred pounds of butter is now common. The latest record has been made by the cow "Renn Ross", 14,439, with 15,072 lbs. of milk and 731 lbs. of butter. This cow is owned by John R. Valentine, Bryn Mawr, Pa., who has a number of Ayrshires that are making records of from 10 to 15 thousand pounds of milk in one year. This is calculated to be the highest official record of any Ayrshire cow in the United States, Scotland or Canada. She is a strong, rugged cow, of great constitution, weighing about 1500 lbs. The record was made under the supervision of the Pennsylvania Experiment Station and the American Ayrshire Association. Through this yearly test and Ayrshire breeders are beginning to find out that they have a large number of cows, that when given a chance, are wonderful producers.—W. F. S.

AYRSHIRE RECORD OF MILK AND FAT
—Since my last report the following cow and two year old heifers have registered in the Record of Performance test:
In the mature class, "Daisy Queen," 708, owned by E. Cahoon, Harriestville, Ont., yielding a total of 3,356 per cent. fat, 11,224 lbs. milk, testing an average of 3.9 per cent. fat, yielding 446.2 lbs. fat.
In the 2 year old class, "Annie of Warkworth," 21,493, owned by A. Hume, Menie, Ont., 6,629 lbs. milk, testing an average of 4.55 per cent., yielding 284.5 lbs. fat; "Daisy Queen 2nd," 2,760, owned by E. Cahoon, Harriestville, Ont., 6,644.5 lbs. milk, testing an average of 3.75 per cent. fat, yielding a total of 353.3 lbs. fat; "Adalia 3rd," 2,249, owned by E. Cahoon, Harriestville, Ont., 6,985 lbs. milk, testing an average of 3.69 per cent. fat, yielding a total of 256.4 lbs. fat.

—All heifers have limited number of cows and heifers have registered. The commencement of the test, 14 mature cows, four three year old heifers, and 37 two year old heifers were registered. The mature cows gave an average of 5,894.25 lbs. of milk, testing an average of 3.73 per

cent. of fat. The four highest records were as follows: "Daisy Queen," 978, owned by E. Cahoon, Harriestville, Ont., 13,183 lbs. milk, and 483.4 lbs. fat; "Almeda of Danville," 13,512, owned by Gus A. Langley, Cap Rouge, Que., 11,327 lbs. milk, and 409.95 lbs. fat; "Daisy Queens," 9,705, owned by E. Cahoon, 11,224 lbs. milk, and 446.2 lbs. fat; "Daisy of Danville," 7,546, owned by J. N. Greenhields, Danville, Que., 12,127 lbs. milk and 396.4 lbs. fat.
The four three year olds averaged 7,747 the milk testing an average of 4.23 per cent. fat; the 17 two year old heifers averaged 7,285 lbs. milk testing an average of 4.1 per cent. fat. Among the best records we notice that of "Adalia 2nd," 23,549, 9,334 lbs. milk and 364.8 lbs. fat; "Adalia 3rd," 22,949, 8,250 lbs. milk, and 354.4 lbs. fat. Both of these were owned by E. Cahoon, Harriestville, Ont. "Barchesse Lucky Girl," 21,263, (imp.) owned by B. S. Ness, Howick, Que., 8,710.25 lbs. milk, and 300 lbs. fat. A large number are now running in the test. W. F.
