

GAME LAW AMENDMENTS.

Hereafter in Ontario the killing of nares and rabbits will not be subject hares and rabbits will not be subject $\frac{1}{2}$ any restriction as to killing or sale under the game laws. The fish and game committee of the Legislature took hares and rabbits out from the Game and Fisheries Act. There will now be an open season for trapping and killing rabbits all year round. and killing rabbits all year round. The committe also made a change in law respecting the shooting of wood cock. The season was advanced a month and will be from September 15 month and will be from September 15 to October 15. The present shooting season is October 15 to November 15, and the complaint has been made that this works to the advantage of American sportsmen since most of the woodcock have left the province' for the south by the latter part of Oc-tober. The Essex County Wild Duck Association sought through representatives to get the committee stop the shooting of ducks in in the seven Lake Eric counties during the month of September. The matter was allowed to stand over until next season.
