Another Letter from the Front.

The following is an extract from a personal letter received from Captain Arthur Chute of Wolfville, written somewhere in France. B. E. F., Oct. 25th, 1915. Yesterday was so full of events for us that I did not get time for my customary Sunday letter.

On Sunday morning we marched into the town and into the grand square where troops were pouring from all the tributary streets. The men were drawn up in massed formation before the band-stand. Flying corps, artillery, dismounted cavalry, infantry, engineers, army service corps and royal army medical corps...
